The Society of St Vincent de Paul was

founded in Paris in 1833, by a group of Catholic students led by Blessed Frédéric Ozanam who were challenged to put their



faith into action and did so through direct contact with and assistance to the poor.



They were inspired by the work and teachings of **St Vincent de Paul**, a priest of the 1600s, who abandoned a profitable career at the French Court, in favour of working with the

marginalised and forgotten poor.

Frédéric's group placed itself under St Vincent de Paul's patronage.

In a few years, the organisation had grown in numbers, and spread to other countries.

By 1844, the first SVP Conference of Charity had formed in England and Wales.

Today, the SVP has over 800,000 members in more than 150 countries across the world.

The work is undertaken by ordinary people, who feel called to turn concern into practical action and help to alleviate poverty in all its forms

WHAT WE DO

We visit the elderly, the sick and the lonely at home, in care homes and in hospital. We transport and we shop for people.

We support families and individuals with food vouchers, food bank referrals, carpets, white goods, furniture, beds and bedding, TVs etc.

We support refugees and asylum seekers with items such as clothing, sewing machines, wheelchairs, walkers, bicycles, food vouchers. Please look out for Newsletter appeals for help needed with some of the requests we receive.

We run a Welcoming Space where we provide: soup, hot and cold drinks, fruit, cold meats, cakes, biscuits, newspapers; help with form filling and job seeking; technical support for mobile phones and tablets; emotional support.

We appeal successfully to various agencies and Trusts for grants to fund our Welcoming Space.

We manage referrals for financial help, and help with debt management.

We have helped with funding for parish trips and meals for those who might not otherwise have been able to attend.

We provide financial support to two SVP Conferences in poorer parts of India and we have taken on a project to build a house for a needy family in India.
